### Protecting the Integrity of Your Evidence

Vehicle Computer Devices	“It depends.” <sup>1</sup>	Keep OFF
Home Electronic Devices	“It depends.” <sup>1,3</sup>	Keep OFF

1. **Do contact** a forensics expert for assistance.
2. **Do not** turn the computer on again after the power has been removed.
3. **Do not** let the batteries run down on portable equipment or dynamic data may be lost.

#### Cautions —

- Do not attempt to conduct your own forensics examination! Even a seemingly innocent act like opening a file to read it may make the digital evidence useless in court.
- Dynamic data may need to be preserved for some investigations. Removing power will destroy it!
- Media must be secured and verified or admissibility of the information on it as evidence may be lost.

#### Good general procedures in all digital evidence seizure cases —

- Restrict access to devices and any attached peripherals. Be alert for remote access to equipment.
- Make every effort to locate all instruction and operating manuals, power cords, chargers, and other related paraphernalia pertaining to the device.
- Take photographs of any screens or displays at time of seizure.
- Do not expose the equipment to heat, cold, or moisture.
